Livestock Mortality Management

The rare, but catastrophic large number mortality events that occur in livestock production gained national spotlight this year with the heat related deaths of cattle in Southwest Kansas. The rarity and the number of animals involved helped fuel the conspiracy theories and public uncertainties regarding the event. Kansas has two agencies that do respond to these events and both did a great job. The Kansas Department of Health Environment Bureau of Field Services aided in the final disposition of mortalities and the Kansas Department of Agriculture Division of Animal Health provided information to the public as to how this type of event occurs.

There are a number of reasons for large mortality livestock events, which is not today's topic. What happens when these do occur regardless of the cause (assuming weather or disease related)? For a permitted livestock feeding operation, a call is placed to KDA and KDHE to alert the agencies of the event and get resources and personnel in play. For many of these operations one item is already in play, the preselection of an emergency burial site with KDHE. This site has been selected with consultation with the facility and KDHE technical staff including a site visit to the proposed location by field staff. Allow this site is pre-selected filed with KDHE a final approval from KDHE and the County Commissioners is required prior to use.

Most often this site is not used, as it is set up for an event that would require the disposal of the entire facility. Typically, events are much smaller but still catastrophic. Basically, in the event of a large mortality incident there are three options; burial on producer owned property, composting either at the facility or nearby, and disposal at a permitted solid waste landfill. Each of these options has pros and cons based on but not limited to cost, personnel requirements, environmental considerations, land requirements, event cause, and time of year.

Burial operations when soil types, depth to groundwater, facility location can provide a fairly quick option. Composting can provide a option that retains the nutrient contained in the carcass for agronomic use however requires time and labor. Lastly, there are times when there is a permitted solid waste land nearby that will take the mortalities. This route comes with tipping fees and is not common.

For daily mortality losses these same options are available for permitted facilities and unpermitted facilities can utilize composting if their site is less than ½ acre in size. KDHE in the last few years has worked to make the process of utilizing mortality management options other than rendering better for Kansas producers. This includes the development of Policy that outlines recommendations and requirements for these options. A new option that has been added during this time is aboveground composting. Basically, this is a shallow burial that promotes carcass degradation by soil microbes and uptake of nutrients by crops or native plants.

Be it further resolved that the Kansas Cattlemen's Association and the Kansas Animal Health Department makes every effort to implement permanent, mandatory visual identification of all imported cattle.

Be it further resolved that the Kansas Cattlemen's Association supports legislation and/or regulation which requires beef promoted as "USA Beef" be born, raised, and harvested in the USA.


